#### President's Note

In this season of great change, we are delighted to inform you of some of the exciting new developments being put into place to ensure that current and future members of OLLI@UGA continue to enjoy the high quality courses and activities that we have all come to expect.

As previously noted, the Development Committee became the Fund Development Committee and the Marketing Committee became the Marketing Development Committee at a 2012 Board meeting. A Steering Committee was also established to create a Statement of Purpose which will guide the Fund Development Committee in its work to assist OLLI@UGA in achieving greater financial stability. he financial mainstay of almost every successful not-for-profit organization, an annual fund allows an organization the fiscal security it needs to carry out its mission. As OLLI@UGA approaches a 1,000 member threshold, the board of directors agreed that the time had come to begin such a fund for our beloved organization.
