



Register now for the 2024 OLLI Travel Study Trips to Scotland and Norway

OLLI@UGA is excited to announce the opening of our next two international trips in 2024 to the picturesque countries of Scotland and Norway.

You'll be drawn to the dramatic scenery, rich cultural heritage, and fascinating history for which Scotland is known. Scotland: A 2-Week Cultural, Historic and Scenic Tour, May 7-24, 2024, is a fabulous, customized tour with extraordinary experiences. Land travel by private motorcoach includes expert local guides at each major stop. Play the bagpipes in Glasgow, ride the Jacobite Steam Train in Oban, visit the Culloden Battlefield in Inverness, watch dolphins frolic on the Black Isle, observe a Scottish weavers demonstration on the Isle of Skye, and taste Scottish whiskey in Oban. The trip also includes visits to ancient archaeological sites and a Neolithic village, among other highlights. Trip cost: \$4,570/person.

Experience the land of the midnight sun during the Summer Solstice in **Scenic Norway**, **June 14-23**, a 10-day motorcoach-and-ferry tour that begins and ends in Oslo. From the deepest fjords of Gerainger and waterfalls at every turn, to the top of Dalsnibba, you'll discover why Norway is one of the most beautiful countries in the world. The trip is also rich with Nordic folklore in Flåm, World War II history in Telemark, the art of Edvard Munch in Oslo and the

music of Edvard Grieg in Bergen. Taste the sweetest strawberries in the Hardangerfjord, explore a life-sized replica of a middle-ages Norwegian village, sit in the pews of 800-year-old stave churches, and ride a ski lift in the Olympic Park at Lillehammer. Trip cost: \$3,699/person.

A new look and improved Google search tools are two goals driving the recent OLLI website tune-up.

Marketing Committee members worked with Tim Meehan, executive director, to scan the website and identify items of concern. They also reviewed current industry practices to perform what could be called "behind the scenes" tasks that will increase the likelihood of OLLI@UGA appearing higher on Google searches.

OLLI members will still find the information they need in the same location as before.

"Ensuring that the website information is current and clear, and, in some cases streamlining page formats, is helpful to both OLLI members and first-time site visitors," Tim explains. An enhanced home page puts more useful information front and center. And adding more key words and phrases throughout the site's language helps make certain that visitors quickly find OLLI@UGA in a Google search and obtain the information they need to join, he concludes.

Although we have change coming, with new goals and purposes, we will continue to balance the needs of those who already enjoy our programs with additional services for the next generations of Lifelong Learners.














