Using Census Records to Find Folks

Census records are essential tools to finding our ancestors – putting them in a place at a specific time. This overview of U.S. census records will touch on population, non-population, territorial, state, and special schedules along with a few options for census substitutes. Some principles for U.S. Censuses can be applied to those in other countries. This three-hour class consists of lecture and hands-on exercises. To become familiar with the records, participants will complete advance assignments before class and will have more exercises to complete during class.
